IN addition to the list of five new real estate subdivisions, now being surveyed and platted which was published in The Star last evening, there are two other large tracts which will shortly come before the Council for approval.

One of the biggest of the tracts now being surveyed is Orange Heights, a subdivision projected by George F. Thompson. This tract is to take up the entire block bounded by Los Robles and El Molino avenues and Mountain and Jackson streets, and surveyors are hard at work completing the plat of the big property.

The other property being platted is what is known as the old Cooley place on North Orange Grove avenue. Messrs. Eason and Brainard are in charge of this subdivision and the property is beautifully located on a car line and very handy to the business district of the city. In all there will be more than sixty lots in the subdivision, and in making the survey the tract has been laid out something after the pattern of a park, with winding roadways and irregularly shaped and picturesque lots. Every endeavor will be made to convert the tract into a very high-class residential property, and the projectors of the enterprise will spare no expense to bring the tract down-to-date before placing it upon the market.
